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How Bad Do U Want Me

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"How Bad Do U Want Me" is a song by American singer and songwriter Lady Gaga from her studio album Mayhem. Interscope Records released it as the album's ninth track on March 7, 2025. It was written and produced by Gaga, Andrew Watt, and Cirkut, with additional songwriting contributions from Michael Polansky. Music critics described the song as synth-pop, drawing comparisons to the pop-oriented work of Taylor Swift. Gaga performed "How Bad Do U Want Me" live on multiple occasions throughout 2025, including as the encore during her Mayhem Ball tour (2025–2026).
